
BRANCH SECRETARY UPDATE

2022 has been another extremely difficult year in the working lives of our members, particularly those keyworkers delivering frontline services, and many others having to adapt to alternative ways of working. Having put themselves at risk in protecting and caring for the most vulnerable, keeping communities safe and well, whether in social care, cleaning, schools, refuse collection, community safety and many more services, both in the City Council and also in the Private, Voluntary and Independent (PVI) sectors. Members have faced a huge amount of stress, faced with declining pay, worried about their health and that of their families, financial hardship and the effects of the cost of living crisis, job cuts and redundancies, with branch reps working incredibly

hard to provide support for our members during these difficult times.

As well as supporting members with workplace issues the branch has been campaigning to protect jobs and services across the council and other employers in the PVI sector, including Academies, as we see the impact of central government cuts to funding for local authorities and providers of public services.

Together with other unions, and local communities, UNISON continues to face a huge challenge to defend jobs and services as we are confronted with devastating cuts to some of the most needed services.

BRANCH ELECTIONS

All elections take place annually. The period of office is 1/4/23 - 31/3/24. All posts are open to job share. UNISON is a representative democracy which means members elect other members to represent them both inside the union, and with employers at local, regional and national level. Departmental Organisers and Senior Reps (who must first be elected as Steward), are elected by the Departmental Stewards at their first meeting following the AGM.

Since the pandemic and change in working arrangements for many members it may be difficult for nominees to get workplace colleagues to physically sign their Nomination Form, so nominees are able to ask colleagues to support their nomination by email.

Nominees for any of the Branch Officer positions must be proposed and seconded by any two members. If you require further information please contact the Branch Secretary.

STEWARD AND HEALTH & SAFETY REP NOMINATIONS

Stewards and Health & Safety Reps must be nominated by 10 members in their department / workplace. Where there are less than 10 members then the majority of members must support their nomination.

UNION LEARNING REP NOMINATIONS

Union Learning Reps are self-nominations so they do not need to ask members to support their nomination. Nominees should complete and sign the Nomination Form and return to the branch.

NOMINATION FORMS SHOULD BE EMAILED TO unison@nottinghamcity.gov.uk OR POSTED to the UNISON Office, First Floor, Loxley House, Station Street, Nottingham, NG2 3NG, by 31 January 2023. Where nominees have been supported by email, the emails of support should be attached to their Nomination Form.

Where more than one nomination is received for the same post a vote/ballot will be held at the AGM unless both nominees agree to job share. In

the event of a vote/ballot each nominee has the opportunity to give an election address of no more than 500 words. If any of the Senior Branch Officer posts are contested (see list above), then a ballot will take place prior to the AGM with the results announced at the meeting.

Late nominations will only be accepted if the post has not been filled by the closing date. If you have any queries about the nomination process please contact the Branch Office.

FACILITY TIME

Facility time is negotiated separately within each employer. At Nottingham City Council (NCC) up to four hours per week facility time is available for Stewards, Health & Safety and Union Learning Reps. Additional facility time is provided for NCC Departmental Organisers and Senior Reps which is proportionate to the membership in that department. Elections for these posts take place at the departmental Stewards meetings following the AGM. If you would like to know if there is a facility time arrangement with your employer please contact the Branch Secretary.

NATIONAL DELEGATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT CONFERENCES JUNE 2023

UNISON's Local Government Conference will take place on Sunday 11 & Monday 12 June 2023 and the National Delegate Conference will follow from Tuesday 13 to Friday 16 June 2023. The conferences will take place at the Liverpool Arena & Convention Centre, Kings Dock, Liverpool.

We are entitled to send five delegates to each conference. Delegates must be proportionate to, and representative of our membership and therefore as the largest majority of our members are women, our delegation must include at least four women, one of whom must be low paid (earning less than £11.80 per hour). Our delegation must also include a young member (aged under 26 at date of conference).

Delegates are required to provide a brief report from the conference which is distributed to the Branch Executive Committee.

All accommodation and travel costs are met by UNISON and if you have children to care for you are able to take them with you as a crèche is provided. All first time delegates will be invited to a briefing prior to the conference. If you would like to be considered to attend one of the conferences please e-mail susan.chettle@nottinghamcity.gov.uk by 31 January 2023. Please include whether you are eligible for the Low Paid Female or Young Member Seat.

A vote will take place at the AGM if there is more interest than places available.

- Raise issues on members behalf with employers.
- Gives out information to keep members informed and involved.
- Keeps UNISON informed of what is happening in workplaces so that issues can be raised locally, and nationally.

- Help and advice on solutions to issues
- Stewards Handbook packed with useful information
- A weekly Bulletin

SAFETY AND LEARNING IN YOUR WORKPLACE

HEALTH AND SAFETY - SAVES LIVES

UNISON Health and Safety Reps make a real difference in every workplace. Health and safety includes everything, from stress at work, to safe work stations to asbestos. In many workplaces there is a legal duty to consult the trade union about health and safety.

Health & Safety Reps in your workplace:-

- Have the right to paid time off for training
- Have the support of a team of UNISON Health & Safety Reps
- Have the right to raise issues and be consulted
- Get involved in investigating potential hazards
- Consult members on working conditions
- Support members with complaints about safety
- Recruit new members

UNISON Learning Reps are all about helping members access the learning they want – whether it is professional qualifications or basic numeracy and literacy skills.

- Support members to take up learning opportunities
- Find out how learning could help to resolve issues at work.
