NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETINGS - 12, 13, 14, 15 MARCH 2024

All members are invited to attend the Annual General Meetings - see pages 2 & 3 for full details. I really encourage you to come along and contribute, especially in the current circumstances members are facing in Nottingham City.

MESSAGE FROM THE BRANCH SECRETARY

Nottingham City Council announced in December that it is proposing to commence a consultation process to implement a further round of savage cuts to jobs and services in 2024/25 amounting to £35.5M, with more cuts to come to meet the budget gap of £53.7M. This is in addition to the £23M overspend in this year's budget leading to the issuing of a Section 114 Notice.

These proposals, such as the proposed closure of day centres for the elderly & disabled, libraries and adult residential care homes, together with cutting what little remains of a previously decimated Youth and Play service within the city, will severely impact some of the most disadvantaged communities and citizens in Nottingham.

UNISON believes that the approach taken by the City Council is short-sighted and will ultimately lead to longer-term problems and financial pressures when demand on statutory services are likely to increase given the ongoing social and financial impact caused by rising inflation and the Cost of Living crisis.

A faceless, undemocratic Improvement and Assurance Board and the recently proposed appointment of Commissioners, both instigated by Central Government, are being used as a proxy to impose Tory ideology, deliberately dismantling all but the provision of statutory services in our city.

UNISON unreservedly condemn these proposals and calls upon the Labour-led Nottingham City Council to use all means possible in order to prevent further cuts and defend these vital services. UNISON calls upon councillors to vote against these and other cuts and also mount a joined-up campaign with other struggling councils to demand fairer funding to local authorities from Central Government.

We also need the support of our members in our campaign to fight the cuts so look out for details of meetings and rallies in the coming weeks.

During the meetings Branch Officers, Stewards, Health & Safety and Union Learning Reps elections take place and the Annual Report and Financial Accounts are received. The Annual Report details the work the Branch has focused on over the past year.

BRANCH ELECTIONS

All elections take place annually. The period of office is 1/4/24 - 31/3/25. All posts are open to job share. UNISON is a representative democracy which means members elect other members to represent them both inside the union, and with employers at local, regional and national level.

Departmental Organisers and Senior Reps (who must first be nominated as Stewards), are then elected by the Departmental Stewards at their first meeting following the AGM.

Since the pandemic and change in working arrangements for many members it may be difficult for nominees to get workplace colleagues to physically sign their Nomination Form, so nominees are able to ask colleagues to support their nomination by email.

FACILITY TIME

Facility time is negotiated separately with each employer. At Nottingham City Council (NCC) up to four hours per week facility time is available for Stewards, Health & Safety and Union Learning Reps. Additional facility time is provided for NCC Departmental Organisers and Senior Reps which is proportionate to the membership in that department. Elections for these posts take place at the departmental Stewards meeting following the AGM. NATIONAL DELEGATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT CONFERENCES - BRIGHTON - JUNE 2024

UNISON's Local Government Conference will take place on Sunday 16 & Monday 17 June 2024 and the National Delegate Conference will follow from Tuesday 18 to Friday 21 June 2024. The conferences will take place at the Brighton Centre, Kings Road, Brighton.

We are entitled to send five delegates to each conference. Delegates must be proportionate to, and representative of our membership and therefore as the largest majority of our members are women, our delegation must include at least four women, one of whom must be low paid (earning less than £12.00 per hour). Our delegation must also include a young member (aged 30 or under at date of conference).

All accommodation and travel costs are met by UNISON and if you have children to care for you are able to take them with you as a crèche is provided. All first time delegates will be invited to a briefing prior to the conference. All delegates are required to provide a brief report following the conference which is distributed to the Branch Executive Committee.
